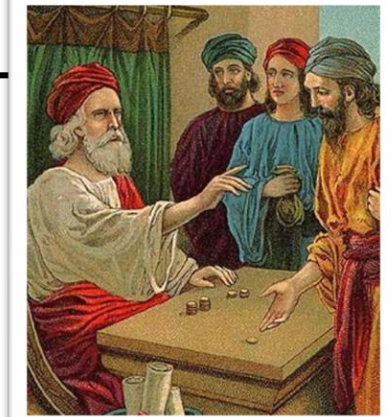

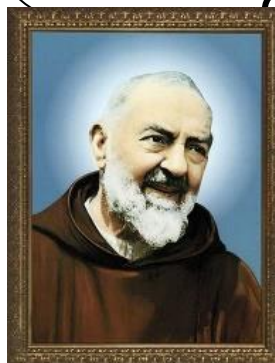

Padre Pio - Memorial 23 September St Pius of Petrelcina
is an Italian Saint born in 1887. He was inspired at 10 years
old to dedicate his life to God. On 22 January 1903, he took
the Franciscan habit and adopted the name 'Pio,' the Italian
version of the name 'Pius' in reference to Pope St Pius V. He
briefly served in the medical unit of the Italian army during
WWI. He is famous for bearing the 'stigmata,' holes in his
hands corresponding to the holes in the hands of Jesus from
his crucifixion. He is known for his patience, devout prayer
and holy life. He died in 1968 and was canonised in 2002 by
Pope Saint John Paul II. (www.catholicnewsagency.com)
